

Environmental Policy

The Company is committed to improving and preserving the environment to meet specified standards consistently. This commitment aims to ensure that customers, employees, and communities recognize the Company as a responsible organization dedicated to continuously enhancing environmental management and preventing pollution in all areas of operations. The Company has established the following guidelines for practice:

- 1. Cooperate with and comply with regulations, laws, and other environmental requirements.
- 2. Control and reduce the amount of dust generated by production-related processes.
- 3. Manage and control the wastewater quality from production processes and residential areas, ensuring safe and environmentally sound practices.
- 4. Save and conserve energy used in production by implementing proper controls and waste management practices.
- 5. Use resources efficiently and cost-effectively by reusing them instead of discarding them
- 6. Fully promote and support environmental activities by collaborating with the government sector, private sector, and local communities.
- 7. Support sustainable development by reforesting and restoring areas affected by mining activities.
- 8. Prepare and review environmental objectives and goals based on the environmental issues arising from the Company's activities at the Saraburi Cement Plant.
- 9. Provide environmental knowledge and training to employees at all levels to raise awareness of environmental issues.
- 10. Support activities aimed at reducing greenhouse gas emissions, such as replacing fossil fuels with renewable sources and transitioning from combustion engines to electric vehicles, etc.

This environmental policy is communicated to all employees and individuals working within the factory area and is also made available to the public. All employees are responsible for compling to this policy through various appropriate media, such as policy announcements, regulations and practices, activity plans, work plans, and manuals, etc.
